What is ArcGIS Online?

AGO (www.ArcGIS.com) is a cloud-based GIS platform that enables non-GIS users to make and share their own maps and applications using the County's authoritative GIS data, as well as data they create on their own. Maps and apps can be viewed on a desktop or embedded on websites and shared on mobile devices anytime, anywhere.

What is the benefit to my community?

Visualizing location-based data on a map rather than in a list can make the information easier for your staff and citizens to understand. Consider spatial questions such as:



- Where do I go to vote?
- Where are parks in my community, and what facilities are at each park?
- What is the zoning for this address?

How much does it cost?

Currently, there are many initiatives and programs Oakland County offers to its communities free of charge, including assistance with the Local Update of Census Addresses (LUCA), GIS, and Property Gateway reports.
