

Oakland County Parks and Recreation provides three parks for off-leash fun with your canine companion.

Dog parks are located at Lyon Oaks County Park, Orion Oaks County Park and Red Oaks County Park. Hours are sunrise to sunset. A daily or annual Oakland County Parks and Recreation vehicle permit is required for parking.

## **Lyon Oaks**

52251 Pontiac Trail Wixom 48393

Features 13 acres with small dog area, benches, shelter, picnic tables and field training area.

#### **Red Oaks**

31353 Dequindre Road, Madison Heights 48071

Access to this dog park is on Dequindre Road, just north of 13 Mile Road.
This 5.2-acre parcel includes a shelter and a small dog area. Limited street light illumination allows for extended hours in fall and winter.

### **Orion Oaks**

1200 Joslyn Road Lake Orion 48360

Dogs and owners enjoy 24 acres with a separate small dog area, two trails and field training area. This park also offers access to an 80-foot dock on Lake Sixteen for dogs only to swim. Modern restrooms are on site.

Dog Park entrance is on Joslyn Road between Clarkston and Scripps roads.

# Make your visit a safe one

Michigan State law requires all dogs older than four months to have a license and wear it at all times. Licenses can be purchased at the Oakland County Animal Shelter and Pet Adoption Center or you can contact your city, village or township for information on purchasing a dog license. Dogs must also have up-to-date vaccinations (Rabies, Distemper, Bordetella) and respond to voice commands.

Oakland County Parks and Recreation strongly recommends individuals obtain both rounds of the canine influenza vaccine for their pets in order for their dogs to visit.
