

Identifying Water Service Line Materials



Lead

A dull, silver-gray color that may be easily scratched using a coin. Strong magnets will not cling to lead pipes.

Copper -

The color of a copper penny.



Rigid pipe that is joined with clamps. Plastic pipe comes in many colors such as white, blue, red, grey, green or black.

Galvanized -

A dull, silver-gray color. Magnets will typically cling to galvanized pipes.



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How To Remove and Clean Aerators

An aerator is the screen on the end of a faucet. It is important to remove and clean it every six months, or after any plumbing work. Here are the steps to clean an aerator:

- 1. Unscrew the aerator from the faucet
- 2. Check for debris caught in the aerator
- 3. Soak parts in vinegar
- 4. Rinse and reassemble the aerator
- 5. Reattach the aerator to the faucet





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
